The Program of Bachelor of Arts in English Language is to provide high-quality human resources with professional qualifications and skills to meet the society's labor demands in the linguistic field and a number of interdisciplinary fields. Graduates are equipped with basic knowledge of politics, culture, society and law; in-depth knowledge of English language; and specialized interdisciplinary knowledge in one of the selected career orientations (Translation - Interpretation for Foreign Affairs, English for Economics - Business, or English for Journalism - Communication). Graduates develop the capability to use English fluently in professional activities and a second foreign language in common activities in life and at work. Graduates develop diverse professional and soft skills to work effectively independently and in groups, and to research and self-study for career development. Graduates have political qualities, ethics, social responsibility, and a high ability to adapt successfully in a multicultural and internationally integrated environment.

#### **\* PROGRAM STRUCTURE AND CONTENT**

#### **1. Program developing principles**

Given the variety of students' English proficiency levels upon admission, a comprehensive placement examination is conducted. This evaluation results in students being placed into two English Proficiency level groups: Intermediate level and Advanced level, with details as follows:

**a.** Intermediate level: based on either of the following two criteria:

- Students who achieve the Intermediate level in the English Placement Tests organized by the English Faculty;
- Students who have an overall IELTS band score of 5.5 or lower or any equivalent international English language certificates recognized in the latest *Internationally Certified Foreign Language Test Results Conversion Regulations* approved by the President of the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam.
- **b.** Advanced level: based on either of the following three criteria:
- Students who achieve the Advanced level in the English Placement Tests;
- Students who have an overall IELTS band score of 6.0 or higher or any equivalent international English language certificates recognized in the aforementioned document;
- Students who win prizes in the National/Provincial Excellent Student Contest for English.

Students of Intermediate level are required to complete 02 General English (GE) courses in their first school-year (named GE III and IV), before taking English for Specific Purposes (ESP) courses.

Students of Advanced level are exempt from GE courses, and eligible to take ESP courses from the first semester of their first school-year; thus will have to take 02 additional Specialized Professional Knowledge courses of their choice (elective).

#### d. Career - oriented Professional Knowledge (all elective)

Based on their career orientation, students choose one out of three combinations of career - oriented elective courses:

(i) Translation - Interpretation for Foreign Affairs;

(ii) English for Economics - Business;

(iii) English for Journalism - Communication,

with details as follows:

• For students of Intermediate level: 18 credits, including 09 credits of Complementary Professional Knowledge and 09 credits of Major - related Professional Knowledge.

• For students of Advanced level: 24 credits, including 09 credits of Complementary Professional Knowledge, 15 credits of Major - related Professional Knowledge.

Students are required to register for a combination of career - oriented elective courses with the DAV English Faculty and the Board of Education before semester III (i.e., semester I of the second year), and are not allowed to change their registration throughout the study process.

Academic advisors and lecturers from the DAV English Faculty guide and assist students in making suitable selection decisions.
