I. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. TRAINING INSTITUTION

Name of the training institution: DIPLOMATIC ACADEMY OF VIETNAM

Mission: Training high-quality human resources to satisfy the diverse needs of society; providing mid-career education; conducting research and strategic forecasting to facilitate policy planning; taking a proactive and impactful stance in advancing Viet Nam's extensive and comprehensive international integration.

Vision: The Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam (DAV) strives to create a comprehensive, in-depth educational and research environment to attract and nurture outstanding individuals who aspire to contribute to society, who are capable of taking leading roles in many fields and reaching out to the world.

Development goals:

- To maintain its position as the leading Vietnamese institution specializing in international affairs and integration; to develop into a prestigious and influential academic and research organization recognized throughout Southeast Asia and the wider world;
- To expand the range of interdisciplinary training based on traditional strengths and new trends;
- To achieve sustainable development grounded on science and smart technology.

Educational philosophy: Comprehensive education that taps potentials, focuses on human values, emphasizes the ability to adapt to change, and has a global vision.

Comprehensive education: The Diplomatic Academy adopts an interdisciplinary and comprehensive approach, integrating theoretical knowledge, practical skills, and critical thinking to cultivate high-quality human resources serving multidisciplinary international integration: Balancing theory and practice, it provides students with opportunities for real-world experiences through simulations, case studies, internships, and educational exchanges to develop soft skills and enhance students' understanding of professions in practice.

Awakening potentials: Encouraging teaching and learning methods that stimulate creative thinking, two-way interaction, free debate, and respect for differing opinions. It holds that education is not only about imparting knowledge but also about helping learners understand themselves, harness their strengths, overcome limitations, and awaken their potentials to find their own paths, building a truly meaningful life.

Focusing on human values: Cultivating and nurturing in learners qualities such as integrity, tolerance, courage, awareness of justice, cooperation, and respect for others, thereby fostering harmony between body and mind, individual and community, and person and living circumstances. This enables learners to self-cultivate a living culture, understand themselves and others, thereby building happiness and success.

Emphasizing adaptability to change and global vision: Focusing on providing learners with fundamental knowledge and developing their critical thinking skills so that they can engage in lifelong learning, be receptive to new ideas, and adapt to a rapidly changing world in the era of science and smart technology; possessing proficiency in foreign languages, solid skills, a proactive attitude, and a broad vision to confidently thrive in international environments.

Achievements: With its 65 years of steadfast development tradition, the Diplomatic Academy has achieved remarkable accomplishments in training high-quality human resources, providing further training to government officials, promoting international cooperation, and strategic research.

(1) *Training of high-quality human resources and government officials:* The Diplomatic Academy has always been at the forefront of innovation in objectives, methods, and training content in line with the strategic direction of the Party and the State. By 2024, the Academy has conducted 50 undergraduate courses, 24 master's courses in International Relations, 12 master's courses in International Law, 10 master's courses in International Economics, 02 master's courses in International Communication, 14 doctoral courses in International Relations, and 06 doctoral courses in International Law.

The Academy has signed cooperation programs to train master's students in International Relations with Lyon III University (France); bachelor's students in International Relations, Communication, Political Science with Victoria University of Wellington (New Zealand); bachelor's students in English Language with Flinders University (Australia); bachelor's students in International Business, Communication

with Monash University (Australia), and bachelor's students in Communication with Macquarie University (Australia). The Academy is currently implementing student exchange programs with Sungshin University (South Korea), Laval University (Canada), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), University of New South Wales (Australia), Monash University (Australia), Gunma University (Japan), Wakayama University (Japan), MGIMO University (Russia), Fulbright University Vietnam, and others.

The Academy's faculty and research staff are also experienced diplomats with practical experience. Many have previously served at Vietnam's diplomatic missions in various countries and international organizations. The majority of the Academy's lecturers have received undergraduate and postgraduate training at leading universities worldwide and are capable of teaching specialized subjects directly in English, Korean, Japanese, French, and Chinese. Additionally, the Academy has a network of domestic and international experts who regularly giving lectures and discussions on specialized topics with DAV's students. Moreover, the Academy is entrusted by the State with the task of training and developing government officials, civil servants, and foreign affairs officers from ministries, agencies, sectors, and localities.

The Diplomatic Academy has received the Certificate of Quality Accreditation for Educational Institutions No. 69/QD-KDCL dated March 12, 2020, issued by the Education Quality Accreditation Center of the Hanoi National University in accordance with Regulation No. 12/2017/TT-BGDĐT dated May 19, 2017, by the Ministry of Education & Training. The Diplomatic Academy is among the few universities that have obtained the Certificate of Program Accreditation according to Decision No. 144-148/QD-KDCL dated June 8, 2021, from the Education Quality Accreditation Center of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Vietnam for all accredited programs, including International Relations, International Law, International Economics, English Language, and International Communication. The Academy is currently implementing a plan to accredit its training programs according to the international standard of FIBAA.

(2) *Strategic research and in-depth studies to serve comprehensive international integration and foreign affairs of the country:* The Diplomatic Academy is a core unit responsible for research and strategic forecasting at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It functions in scientific research on International Relations and manages the scientific research program of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. To date, the Academy has completed hundreds of state, ministry, and institutional-level scientific projects;

successfully organized numerous domestic and international seminars. The Academy is a member of various research institutions such as the ASEAN-ISIS Institute for Strategic and International Studies, the Asia-Pacific Security Cooperation Council (CSCAP), the Vietnam Coordinator in the Conflict Studies Network in Southeast Asia; maintaining cooperation with over 80 foreign research institutes and universities; and having relationships with various foreign embassies and international organizations in Hanoi.

As a leading higher education institution in Vietnam for research and education in International Relations, DAV plays a crucial advisory role for the leadership of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in formulating and implementing the foreign policies of the Party and the State.

DAV plays an active role in the content committees of international conferences held in Vietnam, such as the Francophone Summit, APEC Summit, ASEAN Summit, and ASEM Summit.

Since 1994, DAV has consistently earned recognition from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as an exemplary institution and has received a number of State awards, notably the First-class Labor Order in 1994, Third-class Independence Order in 1999, Second-class Independence Order in 2004, Ho Chi Minh Order in 2009, and First-class Independence Order 2019. Moreover, DAV has received numerous Certificates of Honor and Flags of Merit from the Minister of Foreign Affairs, various Ministries, Departments, Hanoi City, and high-level organizations of the Party (CPV) and the Youth Union.

II. ADMISSION FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE TRAINING

1. ADMISSION CANDIDATES

- All candidates, up to the specified time of admission, must have graduated from high school, including candidates who have graduated from high school in both Vietnam and abroad, and meet the conditions specified in the Admissions Plan for the year 2024 of the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam.

- Having sufficient health to study under the current regulations, without violating the law.

2. ADMISSION AREA: the admission process is open to candidates nationwide.

3. ADMISSION MODES

The Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam will admit students to its regular undergraduate program in 2023 through the following admission modes:

- Direct admission and priority admission as per the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training -**Admission method code 301** (item 8.1, Part II of the Admission Plan).

- Early admission based on high school academic results - **Admission method code 200** (item 8.2, Part II of the Admission Plan).

- Early admission based on interview results - **Admission method code 412** (item 8.3, Part II of the Admission Plan).

- Admission based on the results of the High School Graduation Examination in 2023 - **Admission method code 100** (item 8.4, Part II of the Admissions Plan).

4. ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Each admission method has its own quota. In the event that one admission method does not fill its quota, the remaining slots will be transferred to other methods. Candidates can apply for admission through different methods if they meet all the specified criteria.

- Candidates are allowed to register without limitation on preferences and must arrange their preferences in order of priority from high to low (Preference 1 is the highest preference).

- Candidates are assessed equally based on the evaluation scores, without distinguishing the order of registered preferences, except for cases where candidates have the same admission scores at the bottom of the list, in which case the Academy uses additional criteria for admission. The admission scores are rounded to two decimal places. Candidates can only be admitted to the highest-preference choice possible in the list of registered preferences.

- Based on the admission quotas and the number of successful candidates in the early admission round with preferences for studying at the Academy or candidates admitted and confirmed enrollment in the given fields, the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam will review and decide on additional admission rounds.

5. ACADEMY'S POLICY ON ENCOURAGEMENT POINTS

5.1. Encouragement points under the regulations of the Academy

For early admission modes, candidates will receive additional encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy if they meet at least one of the following conditions:

- Winning prizes in competitions for excellent students/ science, and technology competitions at all levels;

- Being students of Specialized/ National high-quality high schools;

- Having valid international certificates/ International competency standardization exam certificates.

5.2. Principles of Encouragement Point Addition

- Each encouraged subject will have a separate bonus point according to the regulations of the Academy.

- Candidates can receive a maximum encouragement point if they simultaneously meet multiple encouraged criteria (*except for exceptional cases specified in Table 1: Encouragement point levels and Appendix Table 1: Encouragement point levels according to International Certificates/ International competency standardization exam*

certificates).

7. ASSURANCE THRESHOLD FOR ENTRANCE

Each admission method has its own quality assurance threshold. Specifically, as follows:

- For candidates given priority in admissions according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (at section 8.1, part II of the Admission Project); early admissions are based on High School Academic Performance Results (at section 8.2, part II of the Admission Plan) and admissions are based on the results of the High School Graduation Examination in 2024 (at section 8.4, part II of the Admission Plan): The quality assurance threshold for entrance is determined based on the total scores of the three subjects in any combination assessed by the Academy in the High School Graduation Examination in 2024
- For candidates who graduated from high school before 2024 and applied for early admissions based on High School Academic Performance Results (at section 8.2, part II of the Admission Plan): The quality assurance threshold for entrance is determined based on the quality assurance threshold for entrance established by the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam in the year the candidate graduated
- For candidates who graduated from high school under foreign high school programs either abroad or in Vietnam, or those who studied both abroad and in Vietnam, and graduated from high school in Vietnam (at section 8.3, part II of the Admission Plan): The quality assurance threshold for entrance is determined based on the interview results organized by the Academy.

Notes: Except for candidates applying for admissions based on the results of the High School Graduation Examination in 2024, the Academy accepts the results of exempted foreign language exam in the High School Graduation Examination (according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training) to calculate scores that meet the quality assurance threshold for entrance for candidates applying through the remaining methods.

8. ADMISSION METHODS

8.1. DIRECT ADMISSION AND PRIORITY ADMISSION UNDER THE REGULATIONS OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING - Admission method code 301

8.1.1. Admission quota: 3% of the total quota of each Major.

8.1.2. Direct admission candidates

In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory criteria to be considered under this method:

- High school graduate;
- Fall under the following category:

a. National Heroes of Labor, National Armed Forces Heroes, and National Exemplary Soldiers are directly admitted to the fields and programs as specified by the Academy.

b. Candidates who graduate from high school in 2024 and achieve first, second, or third prizes in the national or international excellent student selection exam or in the national or international science and technology competition organized by the Ministry of Education and Training, and are selected to participate, will be directly admitted to major relevant to the subject and the content of the competition theme. The time since winning the prize should not exceed 3 years until the time of direct admission.

c. Candidates who graduate from high school in 2024 and officially win awards in international art competitions in singing, dancing, music, and fine arts recognized by the Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism, will be directly admitted to the major relevant to their competition categories. The time since winning the prize should not exceed 4 years until the time of direct admission.

d. Candidates who graduate from high school in 2024 and participate in the national sports team competing in officially recognized international competitions confirmed by the Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism, including World Championships, World

Cups, Olympic Games, Asian Games (ASIAD), Asian Championships, Asian Cups, Southeast Asian Championships, Southeast Asian Games (SEA Games), and Southeast Asian Cups, will be directly admitted to the major relevant to their competition categories. The time since winning the prize should not exceed 4 years until the time of direct admission.

e. Based on the high school academic performance of the candidates and the requirements of the academic major, the decision to admit into one of the following cases will be made upon review. (In necessary cases, candidates may be required to undergo one year of additional knowledge supplementation before officially starting their studies):

(i) Candidates who are severely disabled having an official disability certificate issued by the competent authority as regulated, and have the capability to pursue certain majors determined by the training institution, but are unable to participate in the regular admission process;

(ii) Candidates who belong to very small ethnic minority groups according to the current regulations of the Government, and candidates from 20 disadvantaged border and island districts in the Southwest region;

(iii) Candidates who have had a permanent residence in impoverished districts for three years or more, studied for three years, and graduated from high school in those poor districts (students from ethnic minority boarding schools counted based on their permanent residence) according to the regulations of the Government and the Prime Minister;

(iv) Candidates who are foreign nationals with test results of Vietnamese language knowledge and competency that meet the current regulations of the Minister of Education and Training.

8.1.3. Priority Admission Candidates

In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission need to meet the following mandatory criteria to be considered under this method:

- Graduate from high school in 2024;
- Meet the quality assurance threshold for entrance set by the Academy (*details are in the announcements of the Academy*);
- Fall under to one of the following groups:

a. Candidates at **items b, c, d in section 8.1.2** are given priority in admission to the appropriate majors according to their preferences (without using the direct admission

priority).

b. Candidates who won gold, silver, and bronze medals in national-level sports competitions organized once a year and those recognized as national sports champions by the General Department of Physical Education and Sports, are given priority in admission to the disciplines relevant to their competition categories. The time since winning the prize should not exceed 4 years until the time of admission consideration.

c. Candidates who officially won awards in national professional art competitions in singing, dancing, music, and fine arts are given priority in admission to the disciplines relevant to their competition subjects. The time since winning the prize should not exceed 4 years until the time of admission consideration.

8.1.4. The process of submitting application documents for admission under the regulations of the Diplomatic Academy

Step 1: Candidates applying for direct admission and priority admission can register through the Admission Information Portal of the Academy at the website: <https://tuyensinh.dav.edu.vn> and print the Registration Form

Step 2: Application dossier includes:

- Registration Form in Step1;
- Certified copies of the following:
 - Certificates of winning awards in the national or international excellent student selection exam, or in the national or international science and technology competition; or Certificates of belonging to the direct admission/priority admission candidates;
 - High school transcript and permanent residence registration (household registration) for candidates belonging to categories (ii) and (iii) at item (e) in section 8.1.2, part II of the Admission Plan;
- Receipt for fee payment certified by the bank (if transferred the fee at the bank counter) or a printed screenshot of the transfer confirmation to demonstrate the payment of the admission fee.

Step 3: Submit the application directly during office hours (morning: from 08:30 to 11:30, afternoon: from 14:00 to 17:00) on the 1st floor, Building D, Diplomatic Academy, or send the application by post from May 15 to before 17:00 on May 25, 2024 (as postmarked) to the following address: Office for Undergraduate Education and Training, Room 109, Building D, Diplomatic Academy, 69 Chua Lang Street, Lang Thuong Ward, Dong Da District, Hanoi.

Note: Candidates need to register for admission on the Admission Information Portal of the Ministry of Education and Training or the National Public Service Portal.

8.2. EARLY ADMISSION BASED ON HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE - Admission method code 200

8.2.1. Quota: 70% of the total quota for each major.

8.2.2. Applicants for admission

In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory criteria to be considered under this method:

- High school graduation;
- Have an average grade point from any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters in grades 10, 11, and the first semester of grade 12, achieving a score of 8.0 or higher;
- Fall under one of the following groups:

(i) Candidates who achieved encouragement/ fourth prize in the national excellent student selection exams, or in the national science and technology competitions organized by the Ministry of Education and Training; the time since winning the prize should not exceed 3 years to the time of admission consideration.

(ii) Candidates who achieved first, second, or third prizes in the provincial Central-city excellent student selection exams for 10, 11 and 12 grades

(iii) Candidates who are students of specialized high schools (*according to Circular No. 06/2012/TT-BGDĐT dated February 15, 2012, issued by the Ministry of Education and Training on the regulations for the organization and operation of specialized high schools, and Circular No. 12/2014/TT-BGDĐT dated April 18, 2014, amending and supplementing certain provisions of the regulations for the organization and operation of specialized high schools*), or national high-quality key high schools

(iv) Having one of the following international certificates/international competency standardization exams still valid to the application submission date:

- **English:** IELTS Academic score of 6.0 or above, or TOEFL iBT score of 60 or above, or Cambridge English Qualifications certificate with a score of 169 or above, or SAT¹ score of 1200 or above, or ACT score of 23 or above.
- **French:** DELF-B1 or above; TCF tout public (5 tests: listening, grammar

structures, reading, writing, speaking) classified from B1 or above.

- **Chinese:** HSK 4 (score from 260) or above.
- **Korean:** Topik 3 or above.
- **Japanese:** N3 or above.

Note: If the candidate possesses international certificates not listed above, the Admission Council will review and make a decision.

8.2.3. Admission scores

- Admission scores include:

(1) The total average score of the academic results in three subjects belonging to the combination for admission¹ to the Academy over any three semesters out of the five semesters in grades 10, 11, and the first semester of grade 12 that the student has chosen to participate in the admission process;

(2) Encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy.

(3) Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any). Regional priority policies applied only to high school graduates in the years 2023 and 2024.

- For the majors of **International Relations, International Economics, International Law, International Business, International Communication, Asia-Pacific Studies, and International Commercial Law:**

Admission scoring formula: Admission Score = A + B + C

Where:

A: is the sum of the average scores of academic performance in three subjects from the combination considered for admission to the Academy over any three semesters out of the five semesters in grades 10, 11, and the first semester of grade 12 that the candidate has chosen to participate in the admission process **x 2/3**

B: is the sum of encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy (at section 5, part II of the Admission Plan).

C: is the priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).

Note: For candidates with a score sum (A + B) of 22.5 points or higher, the priority score C is calculated using the formula: $C = \{[(30 - (A + B))/7,5] \times \text{Priority score level}\}$

specified in Clause 1.2, Article 7 of the University Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

- For the Major of the **English Language**:

Admission scoring formula: Admission Score = $A_1 + B + C$

Where:

A1: is the sum of the average scores of the English subject multiplied by 2 and the average scores of the other two subjects in the combination considered for admission to the Academy in any three semesters out of the five semesters in grades 10, 11, and the first semester of grade 12 that the student has chosen to participate in the admission process.

B: is the sum of encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy (at section 5, part II of the Admission Plan.

C: is the priority score according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).

Note: For candidates with a score ($A_1 + B$) from 22.5 points or higher, the priority score C is calculated using the formula: $C = \{[(30 - (A_1 + B))/7,5] \times \text{Priority score level specified in Clause 1.2, Article 7 of the University Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.}$

- The evaluation points for the admission profile of each training program will be calculated from the top down to the end of the enrollment quota.

- The expected score difference between the various subject combinations for admission is as follows:

- The subject combination for admissions D03, D04, D06 is lower than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 2.0 points
- The subject combination for admissions A00 is lower than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 3.0 points.
- The subject combination for admissions C00 is higher than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 3.0 points.

8.2.4. The additional admission criteria

In case the number of applicants meeting the admissions evaluation threshold for each field of study exceeds the quota, the Academy will apply additional criteria in the following order:

- Higher priority preference.

- The average score of the Foreign Language academic performance over the three selected semesters for admission evaluation for candidates using the subject combination A01, D01, D03, D04, D06, D07; or Mathematics for candidates using the subject combination A00; or Literature for candidates using the subject combination C00.

8.2.5. The early application submission process according to the regulations of the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam

Step 1: Candidates register for early admission at the Enrollment Information Portal of the Academy at the website address: <https://tuvensinh.dav.edu.vn> and print the Registration Form.

Step 2: Prepared a dossier include:

- Registration Form from Step 1;
- Authenticated copies of the following:
 - The supporting documents proving that the candidate belongs to the encouraged groups as specified by the Academy (according to Table 1, section 5.3, part II of the Admission Plan). If the candidate is a student from a specialized high school/ national high-quality school, they need to submit a Confirmation Letter using the provided [template here](#);
 - High school transcript or high school academic results certified by the high school (if the high school transcript is not yet available);
 - Other priority documents as per the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).
- Receipt for the application fee payment certified by the bank (if the fee is paid at the bank counter) or a printed screenshot of the transfer confirmation to demonstrate the payment of the admission examination fee.

Step 3: Submit the application directly during office hours (morning: from 08:30 to 11:30, afternoon: from 14:00 to 17:00) on the 1st floor, Building D, Diplomatic Academy or send the application by post from May 15 to before 17:00 on May 25, 2024 (based on the postmark) to the address: Office of Undergraduate Education & Training, Room 109, Building D, Diplomatic Academy, 69 Chua Lang Street, Lang Thuong Ward, Dong Da District, Hanoi.

Note: Candidates need to register for admission on the Enrollment Information Portal of the Ministry of Education and Training or the National Public Service Portal.

8.3. EARLY ADMISSION BASED ON INTERVIEW RESULTS - Admission method code 412

8.3.1. Quota: 2% of the total quota for each major.

8.3.2. Applicants for admission:

In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered under this method:

- Graduated from a foreign high school program¹ (with approval from the local authorities, achieving an equivalent level to the high school program of Vietnam) in a foreign country or in Vietnam; or having studied both abroad and in Vietnam but graduating from a high school program in Vietnam;

- Have one of the following international certificates valid to the application submission date:

- **English:** IELTS Academic 7.0 or above, or TOEFL iBT 94 or above, or Certificates of Cambridge English Qualifications 185 or above, or SAT² 1300 or above, or ACT 27 or above.
- **French:** DELF-B2 or above; or TCF tout public (5 tests: listening, grammar structures, reading, writing, speaking) with overall level from B2 or above.
- **Chinese:** HSK 5 (score 180) or above.
- **Korean:** Topik 4 or above.
- **Japanese:** N3 (scores 130) or above.

Note: *If a candidate possesses international certificates not listed above, the Admissions Council will review and make a decision*

8.3.3. Admission Scores

- Admission scores include:

- (1) Interview Score;
- (2) Encouragement points/scores according to the regulations of the Academy
- (3) Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education

B: is the encouragement points/scores according to the regulations of the Academy (at section 5, part II of the Admission Plan).

C: is the priority points/scores according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).

Note: For candidates with the total scores (A + B) from 22.5 points or higher, the priority score C is calculated using the formula: $C = \{[(30 - (A + B))/7,5] \times \text{Priority score level specified in Clause 1.2, Article 7 of the University Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.}$

- The evaluation points/scores for the admission profiles of each training program will be calculated from the top down to the end of the enrollment quota.

8.3.4. Additional admission criteria

In cases where at the PASSED evaluation threshold for admission profiles, for each training program, there are more candidates who meet the criteria than the allocated quota, the Academy will use additional criteria in the following priority order:

- Higher preference.
- Interview scores.

8.3.5. The process of submitting early admission applications as per the regulations of the Diplomatic Academy

8.4. ADMISSION BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION EXAMINATION 2023 - Admission method code 100

8.4.1. Admission Quota: 25% of the total quota for each major.

8.4.2. Applicants for admission

In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates who meet all of the following conditions are eligible to submit their application for admissions consideration under this method:

- Graduated from a high school.
- Participate in the National High School Graduation Examination in 2024 organized by the Ministry of Education and Training, achieve a total admission score and regional priority score that meets the minimum input quality standards set by the Diplomatic Academy, and have no subject in the admission subject combination with a result of 1.0 (one) point or below.

- For this admission method, the Diplomatic Academy does not consider exempting foreign language exam results; does not consider using retained scores from previous National High School Graduation Examinations for admission consideration for 2024; and does not grant priority points to candidates with vocational certificates. Additionally, the Academy does not apply encouragement points as stipulated in section 5, part II of the Admission Plan.

8.4.3. Admission score

- Admission score includes:

(1) The total score of each test/subject on a scale of 10 for each test/subject in each admission subject combination;

(2) Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any). Regional priority policies apply only to high school graduates in the years 2023 and 2024.

- For majors such as **International Relations, International Economics, International Law, International Business, International Communication, Asia-Pacific Studies, and International Commercial Law:**

Admission scoring formula: Admission Score = A + B Where:

Where:

A is the total scores of the 3 exam subjects in the admission subject combination.

B: is the priority score according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).

Note: For candidates with an A score of 22.5 points or higher, the priority score B is calculated using the formula: $B = [(30 - A)/7.5] \times$ Priority score level specified in Clause 1.2 Article 7 of the University Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

- For the major of **the English Language:**

Admission scoring formula: Admission Score = A1 + B Where:

A1: is the total score of the English exam multiplied by 2 and the scores of the remaining 2 subjects in the admission subject combination.

B: is the priority score according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any)¹

¹In accordance with Article 7 of the University Admission Regulations and the College Admission Regulations for the Preschool Education major issued with Circular No. 08/2022/TT-BGDĐT dated June 6, 2022, by the Ministry of Education and Training.

- The score difference between the anticipated admission subject combinations is as follows:

- Admission subject combination D03, D04, D06 is lower than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 2.0 points.
- Admission subject combination A00 is lower than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 3.0 points.
- Admission subject combination C00 is higher than the subject combination A01, D01, D07 by 1.0 - 3.0 points

8.4.4. Additional admission criteria

For candidates with the same admission scores at the bottom of the list, the Academy will use supplementary criteria in the following priority order:

- The language exam score for candidates using the subject combination A01, D01, D03, D04, D06, D07; or Vietnamese literature for candidates using the subject combination C00; or Mathematics for candidates using the subject combination A00 will be used to determine the list of successful candidates.

- Higher preference.

8.4.5. Admission process: Following the guidelines of the Ministry of Education and Training.

8.4.6. Announcement of admission results: Following the guidelines of the Ministry of Education and Training.

They are placed into classes based on their proficiency level (if the class size requirements are met). *In the case where students do not wish to/are unable to meet the requirements for Foreign Language 2, they are required to take additional hours of Foreign Language 1 courses with corresponding duration.*
- For the English Language major: Students study English as Foreign Language 1, and Foreign Language 2 (compulsory) is another foreign language. For the Asian-Pacific Studies major, students study Foreign Language 1 corresponding to their chosen specialization (English, Korean, Japanese, or Chinese).
- For the Asian-Pacific Studies and International Commercial Law majors: Students who wish to enroll in Foreign Language 2 courses are required to pay tuition fees under the regulations of the Academy and will be placed in classes based on their proficiency level (if they meet the class size requirements).

- Double/dual Degree Program: Students can enroll in a second-degree program if they wish to and meet the academic requirements. Upon graduation, students are awarded two diplomas and transcripts for the two majors

- Career Guidance/Internship Program: Students have the opportunity to receive career guidance directly from Vietnam's Ambassadors starting from the first year through participation in the Ambassador's Personal Development Journey Program. From the second year onward, students are introduced to internships at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Industry and Trade, Foreign Affairs Departments, various organizations, businesses, corporations, press agencies, embassies, and international organizations in Vietnam and Vietnamese Missions abroad. 12.1. Policy on tuition fee

The tuition fee policy is implemented by the Diplomatic Academy in accordance with Article 8 and Article 11 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and

Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP dated December 31, 2023 by the Government.

- For programs in International Relations, English Language, International Economics, International Law, International Communication that have achieved accredited program standards under the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training, and for high-quality International Business program, the Academy sets tuition fees based on economic-technical norms as stipulated in Circular No. 14/2019/TT-BGDĐT dated August 30, 2019, of the Ministry of Education and Training. The projected tuition fee levels are as follows:

- Beneficiaries eligible for tuition fee waivers and reductions: Based on Articles 14, 15, 16, 18 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

- The mechanism for tuition fee waivers, reductions, financial assistance for study, and support for tuition fee payment: Based on Article 20 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

- The level of tuition fee waiver and reduction: Based on Clause 2, Article 11 of

Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, to calculate the exemption and reduction levels for each beneficiary group, each field/major of study, and each academic year.

- Beneficiaries eligible for study cost assistance: Based on Decision No. 66/2013/QĐ-TTg dated November 11, 2013, of the Prime Minister stipulating the policy on study cost assistance for ethnic minority students studying at higher education institutions.

- The level of study cost assistance: Based on Article 2 of Decision No. 66/2013/QĐ-TTg dated November 11, 2013, of the Prime Minister stipulating the policy on study cost assistance for ethnic minority students studying at higher education institutions.

12.2.2. Scholarship programs for students

In order to promote academic excellence and research spirit in the student community in general, the Academy has implemented various scholarship programs aimed at students with outstanding academic achievements and contributions to the community. Additionally, to ensure access to higher education for students from disadvantaged backgrounds who strive for academic excellence, the Academy also implements various forms of academic encouragement and financial support for students.

In the academic year 2022-2023, the Academy awarded a total of 1310 students with scholarships under various programs. In the academic year 2024-2025, the Academy plans to further increase the budget for scholarship programs (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) to increase the number of students accessing scholarship opportunities and the value of scholarships. Specific increases will be announced at the beginning of the academic year 2024-2025.

The scholarship programs implemented up to the academic year 2022-2023 and the first semester of the academic year 2023-2024 at the Academy include:

(i) Scholarship for Academy's entrance valedictorians: to honor the entrance valedictorians of the Academy, students who achieve the highest admission results through the admission methods specified in sections 8.2 and 8.4, Part II of the Admission Plan for each training program will receive a scholarship worth 5,000,000 VND per scholarship. The Academy implements and awards the scholarship immediately after students complete the enrollment procedures.

(ii) Scholarships for Academic Excellence and Training: awarded to students with good academic performance, with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of B or higher, given each semester with varying levels for students with Excellent, Good, and Fair GPAs. The number of scholarships is specifically determined each year based on students' academic and training achievements, as reviewed and decided by the Academy's

Board of Awards. The value of the scholarships is calculated based on the tuition fee ceiling specified in Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and the regulations of the Academy.

(iii) Nguyen Co Thach Scholarship: a scholarship program for talented students with outstanding academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and leadership qualities, valued from 10,000,000 VND to 30,000,000 VND per scholarship. This is one of the most prestigious scholarships being implemented by the Academy at present.

(iv) For a Better Future Scholarship: To encourage and accompany students from disadvantaged backgrounds who strive for academic success, the Diplomatic Academy will award scholarships covering 100% of the tuition fees for the first semester to eligible first-year students. After completing the first semester, students will submit applications following the guidelines for scholarship consideration.

(v) Dream fulfilling Scholarship: for students from the second year onwards, especially those facing difficult circumstances, who strive for academic excellence. Each scholarship is valued at 5,000,000 - 10,000,000 VND per scholarship (applicable for the academic year 2022-2023).

(vi) Vietnam - China Friendship Scholarship: awarded to students studying Chinese language at the Academy with outstanding academic achievements or students who have overcome difficulties and excelled in their studies, valued at 10,000,000 VND per scholarship. The number and value of scholarships may increase in subsequent years.

(vii) KOCHAM Scholarship (Korean Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Vietnam): awarded to students facing difficult circumstances and achieving a grade of Good or above, valued at 10,000,000 VND per scholarship.

(viii) Talent Development Scholarship sponsored by the State Capital Investment and Business Corporation (SCIC): awarded to fourth-year students with excellent academic performance and active participation in extracurricular activities, with a scholarship value of 10,000,000 VND per scholarship.

Note:

- The conditions, quantity, and values of scholarships are determined based on the annual budget of the Academy and are implemented in accordance with the regulations of the State and the Academy.

- Scholarships at (vi), (vii), (viii): These scholarship programs may change depending on the policies of the partners.
