I. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. OFFICIAL NAME OF THE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION

Name of the Educational Institution: **DIPLOMATIC ACADEMY OF VIETNAM (DAV)**

Mission: With over 60 years of solid development, the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam (herein referred to as DAV) is one of the nation's leading higher education institutions, entrusted with the mission of training high-quality human resources, fostering officials, and conducting strategic and in-depth research in service of the country's foreign affairs and comprehensive international integration

(1) Regarding the training of high-quality human resources and capacity building for officials:

DAV has consistently been a pioneer in reforming educational objectives, methodologies, and curriculum content in alignment with the strategic orientations of the Party and the State. As of 2022, DAV has admitted 48 cohorts of full-time undergraduate students, 22 cohorts of Master's students in International Relations, 10 in International Law, 08 in International Economics, 12 Ph.D. cohorts in International Relations, and 04 Ph.D. cohorts in International Law.

DAV has established joint training programs for M.A. and B.A. degrees in International Relations with Lyon III University (France) and Victoria University of Wellington (New Zealand), a B.A. in Languages with Flinders University (Australia), and a B.A. in International Business with Monash University (Australia). DAV also implements student exchange programs with Sungshin University (Korea), Laval University (Canada), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), the University of New South Wales (Australia), MGIMO University (Russia), Fulbright University Vietnam, and others.

DAV's teaching and research staff includes experienced diplomats with extensive practical expertise, many of whom have served in Vietnam's diplomatic missions and international organizations. Most faculty members have been trained at prestigious universities worldwide and are capable of teaching specialized courses in English, Korean, Japanese, French, and Chinese. DAV also maintains a network of senior domestic and international experts who regularly deliver lectures and hold academic discussions with students.

Moreover, DAV has been assigned by the State to conduct training and professional development for officials, civil servants, and public employees in the diplomatic sector and those engaged in foreign affairs at ministries, agencies, and localities.

DAV was awarded the Certificate of Institutional Accreditation No. 69/QĐ-KĐCL dated March 12, 2020 by the Center for Education Accreditation - Vietnam National University, Hanoi, pursuant to Circular No. 12/2017/TT-BGDĐT dated May 19, 2017 by the Ministry of Education and Training. DAV is among the few higher education institutions to receive program accreditation certificates for all eligible programs, under Decisions No. 144-148/QĐ-KĐCL dated June 8, 2021, issued by the Education Accreditation Center of the Association of Vietnam Universities and Colleges. The accredited programs include International Relations, International Law, International Economics, English Language, and International Communication.

(2) Regarding strategic and in-depth research serving foreign affairs and the country's comprehensive international integration:

DAV plays a core role in strategic forecasting and research for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. DAV is tasked with conducting scientific research in international relations and managing the Ministry's scientific research programs.

To date, DAV has completed hundreds of scientific projects at the national, ministerial, and institutional levels and has organized numerous domestic and international conferences. DAV is a member of various research networks, including the ASEAN Institutes of Strategic and International Studies (ASEAN-ISIS), the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (CSCAP), and acts as Vietnam's coordinator in the Southeast Asian Conflict Studies Network. DAV maintains partnerships with over 80 international research institutes and universities, and collaborates with many foreign embassies and international organizations based in Hanoi.

As a leading institution in international relations research and education in Vietnam, DAV serves as a strategic advisor to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the formulation and implementation of the Party's and the State's foreign policy.

DAV also actively contributes to the content preparation of major international conferences hosted in Vietnam, such as the Francophonie Summit, APEC Summits, ASEAN Summits, and ASEM Summits.

Since 1994, DAV has been continuously recognized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as an excellent unit and has been awarded numerous distinctions by the State, including:

8.1. Admission Methods for the Last 02 Years

- The Diplomatic Academy conducts admissions nationwide.

- In 2020 and 2021, the Academy conducted admissions through two methods: using the results of the National High School Graduation Examination, and its own admission plan which includes:
 - (i) Admission based on a combination of high school academic performance and international certificates;
 - (ii) Admissions based on high school academic performance;
 - (iii) Admissions based on high school academic performance, international certificates, and an interview.

II. ADMISSION FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

1. ADMISSION CANDIDATES

- All candidates who have graduated from high school by the time of determining admission, including candidates who have graduated from high school in Vietnam and abroad, meet the conditions in the 2022 Admission Plan of the Academy.

- Having sufficient health to study under the current regulations, without violating the law.

2. ADMISSION AREA: National enrollment.

3. ADMISSION CODES

The Diplomatic Academy will admit students in the 2022 full-time undergraduate program according to the following admission methods:

- Direct admission and priority admission in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training - **Admission method code 301** (*Section 8.1, Part II of the Admissions Plan*).

- Early admission based on high school academic results - **Admission method code 200** (*Section 8.2, Part II of the Admissions Plan*): For candidates (1) Participate/ Win prizes in competitions to select excellent students; or (2) Are students of Specialized/ National high-quality high schools; or (3) Have International Certificates.

- Early admission based on high school academic results and interviews - **Admission method code 414** (*Section 8.3, Part II of the Admissions Plan*) : For candidates (1) Having special abilities/achievements in the fields of Culture, Arts, Science, Sports, Journalism - Communication, etc., confirmed by competent authorities (equivalent to Provincial/City level or higher) and considered and decided by the Admissions Council; or (2) Winning prizes in international competitions in the fields considered and decided by the Admissions Council.

- Early admission based on Interview Results - **Admission method code 412** (*Section 8.4, Part II of the Admissions Plan*): For candidates who graduated from foreign high school programs abroad or in Vietnam; or have studied abroad and in Vietnam, graduated from high school programs in Vietnam and have international certificates.

- Admission based on the results of the High School Graduation Exam in 2022 - **Admission method code 100** (*Section 8.5, Part II of the Admissions Plan*).

4. ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Each admission method has its own quota. In case an admission method does not reach its quota, the remaining quota will be transferred to other methods. Candidates can register for admission by different methods if they fully meet the prescribed criteria.

- Candidates can register an unlimited number of preferences and must arrange their preferences in order of priority from highest to lowest (Preference 1 is the highest preference).

- Candidates are considered equally based on their scores, regardless of the order of their registered

preferences, except in cases where candidates with the same admission score are at the end of the list, the Academy will use additional criteria for admission. Admission scores are rounded to two decimal places. Candidates will only be admitted to the highest possible wish in the list of registered preferences.

- Based on the enrollment quota and the number of candidates passing the early admission round who wish to study at the Academy or successful candidates who have confirmed their admission to the majors, the Diplomatic Academy will consider and decide to enroll additional rounds.

5. POLICY ON ENCOURAGEMENT POINTS OF THE ACADEMY

5.1. Encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations

In addition to the priority points prescribed by the Ministry of Education and Training, candidates will be awarded encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations if they meet at least one of the following conditions:

- Participate/ Win prizes in competitions to select excellent students;
- Student of Specialized/ National high-quality high schools;
- Have international certificate;
- Have special abilities/achievements in fields confirmed by competent authorities (equivalent to Provincial/City level or higher) and considered and decided by the Admissions Council;
- Win prizes in international competitions in fields considered and decided by the Admissions Council.

5.2. Principles of adding encouragement points

- Each priority subject will have its own encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations.
- Candidates will receive maximum encouragement points if they simultaneously meet multiple priority criteria. *(except for the exceptions specified in Table 1: Encouragement points and Appendix Table 1: Priority points according to International Certificates).*

7. ASSURANCE THRESHOLD FOR ENTRANCE

Each admission method has its own entrance quality assurance threshold. Specifically, as follows:

- For candidates with priority admission in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (*in section 8.1, part II of the Admissions Plan*) ; early admission based on high school academic results (*in section 8.2, part II of the Admissions Plan*) ; early admission based on high school academic results and interviews (*in section 8.3, part II of the Admissions Plan*) and admission based on the results of the High School Graduation Exam in 2022 (*in section 8.5, part II of the Admissions Plan*) : The entrance quality assurance threshold is determined based on the total score of 03 subjects in the Academy's admission combination in the High School Graduation Exam in 2022.
- For candidates who graduate from high school before 2022 and apply for early admission based on high school academic results (*in section 8.2, part II of the Admissions Plan*) or early admission based on high school academic results and interviews (*in section 8.3, part II of the Admissions Plan*): The entrance quality assurance threshold is determined based on the entrance quality assurance threshold of the Diplomatic Academy in the year the candidate graduates.
- For candidates who graduated from foreign high school programs abroad or in Vietnam; or have studied abroad and in Vietnam, graduated from high school programs in Vietnam (*in section 8.4, part II of the Admissions Plan*): The entrance quality assurance threshold is determined based on the results of the Interview organized by the Academy.

Note: Except for candidates who register for admission based on the results of the High School Graduation Exam in 2022, the Academy accepts the results of foreign language exemption in the High School Graduation Exam (in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training) to calculate the score to meet the entrance quality assurance threshold for candidates who register for admission by the remaining methods.

8. ADMISSION METHODS

8.1. Direct Admission and Priority Admission According to the Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (MOET) - Admission Method Code: 301

8.1.1. Admission Quotas: 3% of total quota of each major.

8.1.2. Direct Admission Candidates:

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered for admission by this method:

- High school graduate;

- Fall under the following category:

(1) National Heroes of Labor, National Armed Forces Heroes, and National Exemplary Soldiers are directly admitted to the fields and programs as specified by the Academy.

(2) Candidates with high achievements in international Olympic competitions and graduating

from high school in 2022 will be directly admitted to the Academy in the field appropriate to the subject in which the candidate won the prize. The time of winning the prize must not exceed 03 years from the time of direct admission.

(3) Candidates who win First, Second, and Third prizes in the national English Language competition and graduate from high school in 2022 will be directly admitted to the Academy in the same subject in which they won the prize (English Language). The time of winning the prize must not exceed 03 years from the time of direct admission.

(4) Candidates who are ethnic minorities with very few people according to current regulations of the Government and candidates from 20 poor border and island districts in the Southwest region; or candidates who have had a permanent residence of 3 years or more, studied for 3 years and graduated from high school in poor districts (boarding students for ethnic minorities are calculated based on their permanent residence) in accordance with regulations of the Government and the Prime Minister, with academic performance in grades 10, 11, and 12 of Good or higher, will be considered and decided by the Academy to directly enroll them into the major according to the candidate's preferences.

(5) For foreign candidates who wish to study at the Diplomatic Academy, the Admissions Council will base on the high school academic results, the results of the knowledge and Vietnamese language proficiency test meeting the regulations in Article 6 of Circular No. 30/2018/TT-BGDĐT dated December 24, 2018 regulating the management of foreigners studying in Vietnam of the Minister of Education and Training to consider and decide on admission.

8.1.3. Priority Admission Candidates

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered for admission by this method:

- Graduated from high school in 2022;

- Fall under the following category:

➤ Candidates who have won the **First, Second and Third Prize** with high school graduation exam results that meet the input quality assurance criteria set by the Diplomatic Academy in the national science and technology competition will be given priority for admission to the Academy in the field appropriate to the topic in which the candidate won the prize.

➤ Candidates who have won the **First, Second and Third Prize** in the national excellent student selection exam, and had high school graduation exam results that meet the input quality assurance criteria prescribed by the Diplomatic Academy will be given priority for admission to the Academy in the major appropriate to the exam subject in which the candidate won a prize. Specifically, as follows:

8.2. EARLY ADMISSION BASED ON HIGH SCHOOL RESULTS - Admission method code 200

*(Combining 02 methods: (i) Admission based on International Certificate and High School Academic Results and (ii) Admission based on High School Academic Results at **Announcement of Expected University Admission Method in 2022 April 19, 2022 on the Academy's website**)*

8.2.1. Admission Quotas: 67% of total quota for each major.

8.2.2. Admission candidates

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered for admission by this method:

- High school graduate;
- Have an average score of 8.0 or higher in any 3 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12;
- Fall under the following category:

(1) Participate in/ Win a prize in the International Olympic Competition/ National Excellent Student Competition/ National Science and Technology Competition according to the provisions of Article 8, current Regulations on university and college admissions for Preschool Education; or Win First, Second, Third Prize in the Provincial/City-level Excellent Student Competition for grades 10, 11 or 12.

(2) Is a student of a specialized high school *(According to Circular No. 06/2012/TT-BGDDT dated February 15, 2012 of the Ministry of Education and Training promulgating the Regulations on organization and operation of Specialized High Schools and Circular No. 12/2014/TT-BGDDT dated April 18, 2014 of the Ministry of Education and Training amending and supplementing a number of articles in the Regulations on organization and operation of Specialized High Schools)*, or national key high school.

(3) Have one of the following International Certificates that are still valid as of the date of application submission:

- **English:** IELTS Academic 6.0 or higher, or TOEFL iBT 60 or higher, or Cambridge English Qualifications 169 or higher, or SAT 1200 or higher, or ACT 25 or higher.
- **French:** DELF-B1 or higher or TCF from 300 points or higher.
- **Chinese:** HSK 4 (score from 270) or higher.

- **Korean:**from Topik 3 and above.
- **Japanese:**from N3 and above.

Note: *If candidates have International Certificates not listed above, the Admissions Board will consider and decide.*

8.2.3. Admission score

- Admission scores include:

(1) The sum of the average score of the learning results of the 03 subjects in the admission group⁴Enter the Academy in any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 chosen to participate in the admission exam;

(2) Priority points.

- For International Relations, ***International Economics, International Law, International Business, International Communication, Asia - Pacific Studies and International Commercial Law:***

Formula for calculating admission score: Admission score = A+B+C+D

In which: A & B & C: is the average score of the learning results of 03 subjects in the admission combination to the Academy in any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 chosen to participate in the admission exam.

D: is the priority point.

- For the major ***English Language:***

Formula for calculating admission score: Admission score = Ax2+ B + C + D

In which:

A: is the average score of the English subject results of any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 selected for admission.

B & C: is the average score of the learning results of the remaining 02 subjects in the admission combination of any 3 semesters in the 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 selected for admission.

D: is the priority point.

- Priority points include:

- Priority points in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

- Encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations in Section 5, Part II of the Admission Plan.

- The application evaluation score of each training program will be calculated from top to bottom until the quota is filled.

⁴Candidates can choose many combinations for admission, but the combinations must belong to the 3 semesters chosen to participate in the admission.

- The expected difference in scores between the subject combinations for admission is as follows:
 - The admission subject combination D03, D04 is 1.0 point lower than the admission subject combination A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07.
 - The C00 admission subject combination is 1.0 - 1.5 points higher than the A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07 admission subject combinations.

8.2.4. Additional Admission Criteria

In case the number of candidates at the PASSED admission application assessment threshold of each training major is greater than the quota, the Academy will use the sub-criteria in the following order:

- Higher priority choices.
- The average score of the Foreign Language subject in the 3 selected semesters for admission for candidates using the admission subject combinations A01, D01, D03, D04, D06, D07; or Mathematics for candidates using the admission subject combination A00; or Literature for candidates using the admission subject combination C00.

Note: Candidates need to register for admission on the Ministry of Education and Training's

8.3. EARLY ADMISSION BASED ON HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION RESULTS AND INTERVIEW - Admission method code 414

8.3.1. Admission Quotas: 3% of total quota for each major.

8.3.2. Admission candidates

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered for admission by this method:

- High school graduate;
- Have an average score of 8.0 or higher in any 3 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12;
- Fall under the following category:
 - (1) Have special abilities/achievements in the fields of Culture, Arts, Science, Sports, Journalism - Communication, etc., confirmed by competent authorities (equivalent to Provincial/City level or higher) and considered and decided by the Admissions Council.
 - (2) Win prizes in international competitions in fields considered and decided by the Admissions Council.

8.3.3. Admission score

- Admission scores include:
 - (1) The total of the average score of the learning results of 03 subjects in the admission combination to the Academy in any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 selected to participate in the admission;
 - (2) Interview point;
 - (3) Priority points.
- For following majors: *International Relations, International Economics, International Law, International Business, International Communication, Asia - Pacific Studies và International Commercial Law*:

Formula for calculating admission score: Admission score = A+B+C+D+E

In which:

A & B & C: is the average score of the learning results of 03 subjects in the admission combination to the Academy in any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 chosen to participate in the admission exam.

D: is the Interview score (on a scale of 10).

E: is priority point.

- For *English Language*:

Formula for calculating admission score: Admission score = Ax2+B+C+D+E

In which:

A: is the average score of the English subject results of any 3 semesters out of 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 selected for admission.

B & C: is the average score of the remaining 02 subjects in the admission combination of any 3 semesters in the 5 semesters of grades 10, 11 and semester 1 of grade 12 selected for admission.

D: is the Interview score (on a scale of 10).

E: is the priority point.

- Priority points include:

➤ Priority points in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

➤ Encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations in Section 5, Part II of the Admission Plan.

- The application evaluation score of each training program will be calculated from top to bottom until the quota is filled.

- The expected difference in scores between the subject combinations for admission is as follows:

➤ The admission subject combination D03, D04 is 1.0 point lower than the admission subject combination A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07.

➤ The C00 admission subject combination is 1.0 - 1.5 points higher than the A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07 admission subject combinations.

8.4.1. Admission Quotas: 2% of total quota for each major.

8.4.2. Admission candidates

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered for admission by this method:

- Graduated from a foreign high school program (permitted by the host country, achieving a level equivalent to the Vietnamese high school level) abroad or in Vietnam; or had time to study abroad and in Vietnam, graduated from a high school program in Vietnam;
- Have one of the following international certificates that are still valid as of the date of application submission:

- **English:** IELTS Academic 6.0 or higher, or TOEFL iBT 60 or higher, or Cambridge English Qualifications 169 or higher, or SAT 1200 or higher, or ACT 25 or higher.
- **French:** DELF-B1 or higher or TCF from 300 points or higher.
- **Chinese:** HSK 4 (score from 270) or higher.
- **Korean:** from Topik 3 and above.
- **Japanese:** from N3 and above.

Note: *If candidates have international Certificates not listed above, the Admissions Board will consider and decide.*

8.4.3. Admission score

- Admission scores include:

- (1) Interview Score;
- (2) Priority points.

- Formula for calculating admission score: Admission score = A+B

In there:

A: is the Interview score (on a scale of 10).

B: is the priority point.

- Priority points include:

➤ Priority points in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

➤ Encouragement points in accordance with the Academy's regulations in Section 5, Part II of the Admission Plan.

- The application evaluation score of each training program will be calculated from top to bottom until the quota is filled.

8.4.4. Additional Admission Criteria

In case the number of candidates at the PASSED admission application assessment threshold of each training major is greater than the number of quotas, the Academy will use the sub-criteria in the following order of priority:

- Higher priority choices.

- Interview Score.

8.5. ADMISSION BASED ON 2022 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION EXAM RESULTS - Admission method code 100

8.5.1. Admission Quotas: 25% of total quota for each major.

8.5.2. Admission Candidates:

In addition to the general conditions as prescribed, candidates who fully meet the following conditions are eligible to submit application for admission:

- High school graduate

- Participate in the High School Graduation Exam in 2022 organized by the Ministry of Education and Training, with a total admission score and regional and subject priority points that meet the entrance quality assurance threshold prescribed by the Diplomatic Academy or higher, and no exam subject in the admission combination has a result of **1.0 (one)** points or less.

- For this admission method, the Diplomatic Academy does not use the results of foreign language exemption; does not use the test scores reserved from the High School Graduation Exams and the National High School Exams of previous years for admission in 2022; does not add priority points for candidates with vocational certificates; does not apply priority points in accordance with the Academy's regulations in Section 5, Part II of the Admissions Plan.

8.5.3. Admission Score:

- Admission scores include:

(1) Total score of exams/subjects on a 10-point scale for each exam/subject of each admission group;

(2) Priority points for subjects and regions in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

- Formula for calculating admission score:

➤ For following majors: International Relations, **International Economics, International Law, International Business, International Communication, Asia - Pacific Studies and International Commercial Law**: Admission score = (Subject 1 score + Subject 2 score + Subject 3 score) + Priority score by region and subject in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any).

➤ For the major **English Language**: Admission score = (Subject 1 score + Subject 2 score + English score x 2) + Priority score by region and subject converted in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training (if any) .

- The expected difference in scores between the subject combinations for admission is as follows:

➤ The admission subject combination D03, D04 is 1.0 point lower than the admission subject combination A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07.

➤ The C00 admission subject combination is 1.0 - 1.5 points higher than the A00, A01, D01, D06 and D07 admission subject combinations.

8.5.4. Additional Admission Criteria:

For candidates with the same admission score at the end of the list, the Academy will use the secondary criteria in the following order of priority:

- Higher priority choices.

- The score of the Foreign Language exam for candidates using the admission subject combination A01, D01, D03, D04, D06, D07; or the Literature exam for candidates using the admission subject combination C00; or the Math exam for candidates using the admission subject combination A00 to determine the list of admitted candidates.

➤ Most of the lecturers at the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam have received their training from world-renowned universities. In addition to their academic expertise, many of them are experienced diplomats with extensive hands-on experience in foreign affairs and international integration.

➤ A dedicated team of academic advisors and class supervisors is always available to offer guidance and support for students in both academic matters and career orientation.

- Facilities for Education and Training Activities: DAV provides students with modern, fully equipped lecture halls and multipurpose classrooms, as well as access to an extensive e-library that

offers a wide range of academic resources from both domestic and international sources.

- Learning Support Programs:

- DAV organizes diverse academic support activities such as expert-led seminars, talks with guest speakers, study tours, and exchange programs. These initiatives aim to enrich students' academic experience and expand their global perspectives.
- Research Activities: Students are encouraged to engage in scientific research through student research clubs, research assistance opportunities at DAV's think tanks (e.g., East Sea Institute, Institute for Strategic and Foreign Policy Studies), and participation in domestic and international conferences and academic competitions.

- Foreign Language 2 is an elective module. Students may choose from English, German, Korean, Russian, Japanese, French, Spanish, or Chinese, subject to the same class size condition.
- For students majoring in Asia-Pacific Studies and International Commercial Law , any language may be selected as Foreign Language 2 (if class size requirements are met) , and tuition fees will follow the Academy's specific regulations.
- For the English Language major, Foreign Language 1 is English. For the Asia-Pacific Studies major, Foreign Language 1 must correspond to the student's chosen specialization: English, Korean, Japanese, or Chinese.

- Double/dual Degree Program: Students are allowed to register for a second undergraduate program if they meet the academic requirements. Upon graduation, students will be awarded two bachelor's degrees and two sets of academic transcripts for both majors.

- Career Orientation and Internship Program: Students are guided in their career planning from the very first year through direct mentoring by Vietnamese Ambassadors and former Ambassadors as part of the "Personal Development Journey with Ambassadors" program. From the second year onward, students are offered internship opportunities at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Major and Trade, provincial Departments of Foreign Affairs, international organizations, businesses, media agencies, embassies, and international organizations based in

Vietnam, as well as Vietnamese diplomatic missions abroad. Graduates are given priority for job referrals matching their academic background. Outstanding graduates may be considered for recruitment as lecturers or researchers at the Academy, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and other ministries, central agencies, or local authorities.

- Student Exchange Program: Students are encouraged to join short-term student exchange programs at the Academy’s partner universities, including Sungshin University (Korea), Laval University (Canada), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), the University of New South Wales (Australia) , MGIMO University (Russia) , Fulbright University Vietnam, and others.
- Employment Opportunities: Upon graduation, students will have the opportunity to pursue careers at ministries, governmental agencies, international organizations, foreign representative offices in Vietnam, media agencies, and businesses both within and outside of Vietnam.

12.1. Policy on Tuition Fee

The Diplomatic Academy implements its tuition fee policy in accordance with Articles 8 and 11 of Government Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

- For undergraduate majors in International Relations, English Language, International Economics, International Law, International Communication (which have been accredited in accordance with the standards set by the Ministry of Education and Training), and the high-quality program in International Business, the tuition fees are determined based on the technical and economic norms stipulated in Circular No. 14/2019/TT-BGDĐT dated August 30, 2019.

In the 2022-2023 academic year, as the economy is in recovery after the COVID-19 pandemic and in an effort to ease financial burdens for students and parents, the proposed monthly tuition fee per student are as follows:

12.2. Policy on Scholarship and Financial Support

- The Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam adheres to the Government's regulations on tuition collection and management for educational institutions within the national education system, as well as policies on tuition waiver, reduction, and financial support for students, issued pursuant to Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

In an effort to foster academic excellence and ensure equal access to higher education for students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, the Academy has implemented a range of scholarships and financial support programs. As of the 2021-2022 academic year, the following scholarship programs have been made available:

(i) Scholarships for Academic Excellence and Training:

Awarded to students with strong academic performance, with a minimum semester Grade Point Average (GPA) of "Fair" or above. Scholarships are awarded each semester according to the following scale:

140% of the semester tuition fee for students with an "Excellent" GPA

120% for those with a "Good" GPA

100% for those with a "Fair" GPA

The number of scholarships is determined annually, based on students' academic and conduct records, and approved by the Academy's Board of Awards.

(ii) Nguyen Co Thach Scholarships:

Granted to outstanding students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership potential, and active participation in extracurricular activities. The value of each scholarship ranges from VND 10,000,000 to VND 30,000,000. This program was launched in 2021, with nine scholarships awarded in its first year.

(iii) Dream fulfilling Scholarship:

Targeted at second-year students and above from underprivileged backgrounds who exhibit determination in their studies. In 2021-2022, 40 scholarships worth VND 5,000,000 each were awarded. Beginning in 2022-2023, BIDV Trảng An has pledged an annual donation of VND 100,000,000 for this fund over three years.

(iv) Raymond Reamy Scholarships:

Awarded to second-year and higher students who are economically disadvantaged and have achieved high academic results in English. A maximum of 15 scholarships, valued between VND 3,000,000 and VND 5,000,000 each, are available annually.

(v) KOCHAM Scholarship (Korean Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Vietnam):

Awarded to students facing difficult circumstances and achieving a grade of Good or above. Each scholarship is valued at VND 10,000,000. In 2020-2021, 20 scholarships were awarded exclusively to students of the Academy.

(vi) SCIC Scholarships (State Capital Investment Corporation) - “Empowering Young Talent”:

Offered to fourth-year students who demonstrate academic excellence and active engagement in extracurricular activities. Each scholarship is valued at VND 10,000,000. In the 2021-2022 academic year, five students received this award.

(vii) “Inspiring Hope” Scholarships (PVcomBank):

In the 2021-2022 academic year, eight full scholarships - each covering up to VND 20,000,000 per year, including tuition and living expenses—were awarded to first-year students with exceptional academic motivation and special financial hardship.

(viii) Vingroup Scholarships (Thien Tam Foundation):

Nine scholarships covering 50% of the annual tuition fee were granted to students who excelled academically while facing serious personal or family challenges.

(ix) COVID-19 Support Scholarships:

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Academy provided relief support and awarded 20 scholarships worth VND 2,000,000 each, sponsored by Japan Airlines and VPBank, to assist students affected by the pandemic.

From the 2022-2023 academic year onward, in addition to the regular scholarship and financial support schemes, newly admitted students may be eligible for the following scholarships upon successful admission and enrollment at the Diplomatic Academy:

(x) Scholarships for the Academy’s Valedictorians:

Awarded to students with the highest entrance scores in each undergraduate major, based on the admission methods outlined in Sections 8.1, 8.2, 8.3, and 8.5, Part II of the Academy’s Admissions Scheme. Each scholarship is valued at VND 5,000,000 and is granted immediately upon

completion of enrollment procedures.

(xi) For a Better Future Scholarship:

Designed to support newly admitted students from disadvantaged backgrounds who are admitted through the admission methods listed in Sections 8.1, 8.2, 8.3, and 8.5, Part II of the Admissions Scheme. A total of 20 scholarships, each covering 80% of the first year's tuition fee, will be awarded. Candidates must submit their application forms and supporting documents before July 2, 2022.

15. ORGANIZING TRAINING PROGRAMS TO IMPROVE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND EXPERTISE ON FOREIGN AFFAIRS; FOREIGN LANGUAGES & INTERPRETING SKILLS

The Foreign Service Center (FOSET), a unit under the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam (DAV), is tasked with organizing training programs to enhance knowledge, skills, diplomatic professionalism, foreign language proficiency, and translation/interpretation competencies for officials and public employees of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; as well as those working in external affairs across ministries, sectors, and localities. FOSET also provides training services for

organizations and individuals in accordance with the provisions of law.

Annually, FOSET organizes various training courses for officials and public employees of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, other ministries, sectors, and localities. The Center also implements training schemes approved by the Prime Minister to enhance knowledge and skills for officials and public employees involved in international integration. These programs constitute a key component in the professional development of human resources serving international integration at both central and local levels.

In addition, the Center provides a wide range of training and refresher courses in English, French, Chinese, Korean, and Japanese (basic, advanced, and specialized), as well as programs in translation and interpretation, and skill-building courses in negotiation, public speaking, critical thinking, leadership, and management, among others, to meet the diverse needs of society.
