II. ADMISSION FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

1. Admission Candidates

In accordance with the current regulations on undergraduate admissions of the Ministry of Education and Training (MOET), candidates applying to the Academy at the time of application review (prior to the official announcement of admission results) must meet the following criteria:

- Have been officially recognized as having graduated from high school (THPT) in Viet Nam or hold a foreign high school diploma recognized as equivalent, and meet the requirements specified in the Academy's 2025 Admission Information.
- Having sufficient health to study under the current regulations.
- Meet the minimum entry threshold as defined in Section 3 of this Admission Information.

- Provide complete personal information and application documents in accordance with regulations.

For academic programs that apply multiple admission methods, the Academy shall specify the eligibility and requirements for each method.

For Candidates with disabilities that affect their learning capacity, the Academy will adopt necessary measures and provide maximum support for those wishing to register and pursue programs appropriate to their health condition.

2. Admission Methods

2.1. Method 1: Direct Admission and Priority Admission under the Regulations of The Ministry of Education and Training (Admission Method Code 301)

2.1.1. Direct Admission Candidates

a. National Heroes of Labor, National Armed Forces Heroes, and National Exemplary Soldiers are directly admitted to the fields and programs as specified by the Academy.

b. Candidates who have won First, Second, or Third Prizes in the national or international excellent student selection exam in subjects within the combinations used in the Academy's admission method based on the results of National High School Graduation Examination (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Literature, History, Geography, English, French, Chinese, Japanese, Korean) and Informatics, within 03 years prior to the time of direct admission consideration, shall be granted direct admission to programs according to their registered preferences.

c. Candidates who have won First, Second, or Third Prizes in national or international science and technology competitions organized or nominated by the Ministry of Education and Training, within 03 years prior to the time of direct admission consideration, shall be reviewed and evaluated by the Admission Council and may be granted direct admission to programs relevant to the subject matter of their projects.

d. Based on the high school academic performance of the candidates and the requirements of the academic major, the decision to admit into one of the following cases will be made upon review. (In necessary cases, candidates may be required to undergo one year of additional knowledge supplementation before officially starting their studies):

- (i) Candidates who are severely disabled having an official disability certificate

issued by the competent authority as regulated, and have the capability to pursue certain majors determined by the training institution, but are unable to participate in the regular admission process;

(ii) Candidates who belong to very small ethnic minority groups according to the current regulations of the Government, and candidates from 20 disadvantaged border and island districts in the Southwest region;

(iii) Candidates who have had a permanent residence in impoverished districts for three years or more, studied for three years, and graduated from high school in those poor districts (students from ethnic minority boarding schools counted based on their permanent residence) according to the regulations of the Government and the Prime Minister;

(iv) Candidates who are foreign nationals with test results of Vietnamese language knowledge and competency that meet the current regulations of the Minister of Education and Training.

2.1.2. Priority Admission Candidates

Candidates under *item b, Section 2.1.1* who have won prizes in subjects not included in the combinations used in the Academy's admission method based on the National High School Graduation Examination results, within 03 years prior to the time of admission consideration, shall be given priority admission to programs according to their registered preferences. Candidates must additionally meet the minimum quality assurance threshold prescribed by the Academy (*see Section 3 for details*).

2.2. Method 2: Admission based on a combination of High School Academic Records and International Certificates¹ for candidates who completed the Vietnamese High School Program (Admission Method Code 410)

2.2.1. Candidates for Admission: In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered under this method:

- Have an overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of all subjects across 06 semesters (Grades 10, 11, and 12) of at least 8.0;

¹ International Certificates include: international foreign language certificates or standardized international competency tests, in accordance with the regulations of the Academy.

- Have one of the following international certificates valid to the application submission date:
 - **English:** IELTS Academic 6.0 or above, or TOEFL iBT 60 or above, or PTE-A 46 or above, or Certificates of Cambridge English Qualifications 169 or above, or SAT² 1200 or above, or ACT³ 23 or above.
 - **French:** DELF-B1 or above; TCF tout public (5 tests: listening, grammar structures, reading, writing, speaking) classified from B1 or above.
 - **Chinese:** HSK 4 (score from 260) or above.
 - **Korean:** Topik 3 or above.
 - **Japanese:** N3 or above.
 - **German⁴:** DSH 1 or above; or Goethe-Zertifikat B1; or ÖSDZertifikat B1; or TELC B1; or DSD I B1 or above.

Notes:

- *If candidates hold International Certificates not listed above, the Admissions Council will review and make a decision.*
- *Certificates obtained through “home edition” formats are not accepted.*

2.2.2. Admission Scores

- Admission scoring formula:

Admission Score (maximum 30) = Total Score Achieved + Priority Points from MOET (if any)

Specifically:

*** Total Score Achieved = M1 + M2 + M3 + Encouragement Points from the Academy (if any)**

- **M1:** Converted score of an International Certificate on a 10-point scale (selecting one International Certificate with the highest converted score among the following foreign languages: English, French, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, German) (*see Table 1 for details*);

- **M2:** High school academic score in either Mathematics or Literature;

² Candidates using the SAT must register the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam’s institutional code **7488** with the SAT testing organization.

³ Candidates using the ACT must register the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam’s institutional code **8268** with the ACT testing organization.

⁴ Candidates applying with an international German language certificate, if admitted, shall be required to select one of the Foreign Languages 1 currently offered at the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam.

- **M3:** High school academic core in any subject (excluding Foreign Languages and different from M2) that is included in the subject combinations of the Academy's admission method based on the results of National High School Graduation Examination. Eligible subjects include: Literature, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, History, and Geography (*see Table 3 for details*);

[M2 or M3 score = (Average annual grade of Grade 10 + Average annual grade of Grade 11 + Average annual grade of Grade 12 for the respective subject)/3]

- **Encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy:** applied to candidates who have won prizes in high school excellent student selection exam (*see Table 4 for details*);

* **Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training:** including priority points by candidate category and by region, determined in accordance with the current Admission Regulations. The regional priority policy applies only to candidates graduating from high school in 2024 and 2025.

For candidates whose total achieved score is 22.5 points or higher, the priority points shall be determined using the following formula:

Priority points = [(30 - Total achieved score)/7.5] × Priority point level prescribed in the Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

2.3. Method 3: Admission for candidates having the A-level Certificate issued by Cambridge Assessment International Education (United Kingdom) or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma⁵ (Admission Method Code 415)

2.3.1. Candidates for Admission: In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered under this method:

- Have the Cambridge International A-Level Certificate (UK) with a minimum grade of D in each subject; or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma with a total score of at least 30;

⁵ Candidates are required to complete the qualification equivalency recognition procedure at the competent authority.

- Have one of the following international certificates⁶ valid to the application submission date:

- **English:** IELTS Academic 6.0 or above, or TOEFL iBT 60 or above, or PTE-A 46 or above, or Certificates of Cambridge English Qualifications 169 or above, or SAT⁷ 1200 or above, or ACT⁸ 23 or above.
- **French:** DELF-B1 or above; TCF tout public (5 tests: listening, grammar structures, reading, writing, speaking) classified from B1 or above.
- **Chinese:** HSK 4 (score from 260) or above.
- **Korean:** Topik 3 or above.
- **Japanese:** N3 or above.
- **German⁹:** DSH 1 or above; or Goethe-Zertifikat B1; or ÖSDZertifikat B1; or TELC B1; or DSD I B1 or above.

Notes:

- If candidates hold International Certificates not listed above, the Admissions Council will review and make a decision.

- Certificates obtained through “home edition” formats are not accepted.

2.3.2. Admission Scores

- Admission scoring formula:

Admission Score (maximum 30) = Total Score Achieved + Priority Points from MOET (if any)

Specifically:

*** Total Score Achieved = M1 + M2 + M3 + Encouragement Points from the Academy (if any)**

- **M1:** Converted score of an International Certificate on a 10-point scale (selecting one International Certificate with the highest converted score among the following foreign languages: English, French, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, German) (*see Table 1 for details*);

⁶ International Certificates include: international foreign language certificates or standardized international competency tests, in accordance with the regulations of the Academy.

⁷ Candidates using the SAT must register the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam’s institutional code **7488** with the SAT testing organization.

⁸ Candidates using the ACT must register the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam’s institutional code **8268** with the ACT testing organization.

⁹ Candidates applying with an international German language certificate, if admitted, shall be required to select one of the Foreign Languages 1 currently offered at the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam.

- **M2**: Converted score on a 10-point scale in either Mathematics or Literature from the Cambridge A-Level Certificate or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma (*see Table 2 for details*);

- **M3**: Converted score on a 10-point scale in any subject (excluding Foreign Languages and different from M2) from the Cambridge A-Level Certificate or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma (*see Table 2 for details*).

- **Encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy**: applied to candidates who have won prizes in high school excellent student selection exam (*see Table 4 for details*);

* **Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training**: including priority points by candidate category and by region, determined in accordance with the current Admission Regulations. The regional priority policy applies only to candidates graduating from high school in 2024 and 2025.

For candidates whose total achieved score is 22.5 points or higher, the priority points shall be determined using the following formula:

Priority points = $[(30 - \text{Total achieved score})/7.5] \times \text{Priority point level}$ prescribed in the Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

2.4. Method 4: Admission Based on the Results of the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 by Subject Combinations (A00, A01, C00, D01, D03, D04, DD2, D06, D07, D09, D10, D14, D15) (Admission Method Code 100)

2.4.1. Candidates for Admission: In addition to the general conditions as stipulated, candidates applying for admission must meet the following mandatory conditions to be considered under this method:

- Participate in the National High School Graduation Examination in 2025 organized by the Ministry of Education and Training, and have no subject in the admission subject combination with a result of **1.0 (one)** point or below.

* For this admission method, the Academy does not consider using retained scores from previous National High School Graduation Examinations for admission consideration for 2025; and does not grant priority points to candidates with vocational certificates.

2.4.2. Admission Scores

- Admission scoring formula:

Admission Score (maximum 30) = Total Score Achieved + Priority Points from MOET (if any)

Specifically:

*** Total Score Achieved = M1 + M2 + M3 + Encouragement Points from the Academy (if any)**

- **M1, M2, M3**: Scores of the three subjects in the selected admission combination of the Academy from the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 (*see Table 3 for details*);

Notes¹⁰: For admission combinations including a foreign language subject, the foreign language score may be determined in one of the following two ways:

1. Using the foreign language score from the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 corresponding to the admission combination (*see Table 3 for details*); or

2. Replacing the foreign language score in the admission combination with the converted score from an eligible International Certificate in accordance with the Academy's regulations (*see Table 1 for details*).

The Academy accepts an International Certificate in a foreign language different from the original foreign language subject in the admission combination.

Example: A candidate may use a Korean TOPIK certificate to replace the English subject score in the D01, D09,... combinations.

Candidates must submit their International Certificates to the Academy following the instructions provided in *Section 6.4*. During the admission process, the system will automatically compare both options and select the one more favorable to the candidate.

- **Encouragement points according to the regulations of the Academy**: applied to candidates who have won prizes in high school excellent student selection exam (*see Table 4 for details*);

¹⁰ Candidates are required to review Clause 2, Article 39 of the Regulation on the High School Graduation Examination regarding the exemption from the Foreign Language subject in the consideration of high school graduation.

*** Priority points according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training:** including priority points by candidate category and by region, determined in accordance with the current Admission Regulations. The regional priority policy applies only to candidates graduating from high school in 2024 and 2025.

For candidates whose total achieved score is 22.5 points or higher, the priority points shall be determined using the following formula:

Priority points = [(30 - Total achieved score)/7.5] × Priority point level prescribed in the Admission Regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training.

3. Rules on Converting Equivalent Admission Thresholds and Admission Scores Across Different Subject Combinations and Admission Methods

- **Admission Thresholds:** The Academy will announce the minimum admission thresholds after the release of the results of the High School Graduation Examination 2025, in accordance with the general plan of the Ministry of Education and Training (MOET). Specifically:

- For Candidates under Direct and Priority Admission (Method 1 – Section 2.1.2), Candidates applying under the Combined Evaluation based on High School Academic Records and International Certificates (Method 2 – Section 2.2), and Candidates applying based on the results of High School Graduation Examination 2025 (Method 4 – Section 2.4): The admission threshold is determined based on the total score of three subjects in any subject combination accepted by the Academy in the High School Graduation Examination 2025.

Notes: Candidates may use the converted scores of international certificates in accordance with the Academy's regulations to meet the minimum admission threshold.

- For candidates who graduated from high school prior to 2025 and apply under Method 2 – Section 2.2: The admission threshold will be applied in accordance with the Academy’s threshold in the year of the candidate’s high school graduation.
- For candidates using the A-level Certificate issued by Cambridge Assessment International Education (UK) or the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma (Method 3 – Section 2.3): The admission threshold is determined based on the converted total admission score (tentatively set at 24).

- Admission Scores

+ Admission scores for all admission methods are standardized on a 30-point scale and rounded to two decimal places. Bonus points (if any) include encouragement points awarded by the Academy and priority points granted by MOET, totaling no more than 03 points, with the maximum overall admission score capped at 30 points.

+ The Academy will convert admission scores equivalently across admission methods and subject combinations in accordance with MOET guidelines. The rules on score conversion will be announced by the Academy according to MOET’s overall timeline, no later than the time of announcement of admission thresholds.

- Principles of Admission

+ Admission is conducted by training program/major, based on descending order of admission scores until the enrollment quota is filled. Candidates are considered equally based on their admission scores, regardless of the order of preference in their application, except in cases where multiple candidates share the same score at the cutoff. In such cases, the Academy will apply tie-breaking criteria (*see Clause a, Section 5 for details*). A candidate can only be admitted to the highest-ranked preference among those listed in their application;

+ Candidates may apply under multiple admission methods provided that all respective eligibility requirements are met;

+ Candidates may register an unlimited number of preferences but must arrange them in order of priority from highest to lowest (*Preference 1 being the highest*).

5. Other necessary information for candidates applying to the Academy

a. Additional conditions applied in the admission process

In cases where the number of candidates meeting the *eligible threshold* for a given program exceeds the available quota, the Academy will apply additional criteria in the following order:

- *First criterion:* Academic results

+ For International Economics and International Business: use the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 score in Mathematics.

+ For other programs:

* Use the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 score in Foreign Language, or a converted score from an international certificate in accordance with the Academy's regulations.

*If the admission combination does not include a Foreign Language subject, or if candidates have identical Foreign Language scores or converted international certificate scores, the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 score in Literature will be considered.

- *Second criterion:* The candidate's priority order of program registration on the Ministry of Education and Training's Admission Portal.

b. Encouragement points according to the Academy's regulations

For admission methods (2), (3), and (4), candidates will receive encouragement points according to the Academy's regulations if they have won prizes in High School Excellent Student Selection Exam, specifically as follows:

6. Admission Organization

The Diplomatic Academy conducts admissions in accordance with the 2025 general admission plan issued by the Ministry of Education and Training.

6.1. For candidates applying for Direct Admission and Admission Priority under the Ministry's regulations (Method 1 – Section 2.1):

** Application documents include:*

- Admission Registration Form (Candidates download the form from the Academy's Admission Portal and complete it following the provided instructions);

- Certified copies of:

- Certificates of prizes in National or International Excellent Student Selection Exam, or in National or International Science and Technology Competitions; or certificates of eligibility for other Direct Admission categories;
- High school transcripts and household registration documents for candidates belonging to categories (ii) and (iii) under point (d) of Section 2.1.1.

** Application submission timeline and procedure:*

Candidates must complete the application process in two steps:

- Step 1: From June 25 until before 17:00 on June 30, 2025, register online on the Academy's Admission Portal at: <https://xettuyen.dav.edu.vn> (see detailed registration instructions on the Portal).

- Step 2: From July 16 until 17:00 on July 28, 2025, confirm admission or register program preferences on the Ministry of Education and Training's Admission Portal (or via the National Public Service Portal).

6.4. For candidates using the results of the National High School Graduation Examination 2025 (Method 4 – Section 2.4):

Candidates DO NOT register via the Academy's Admissions Portal but instead must register through the Ministry of Education and Training's Admissions Portal (or the National Public Service Portal), in accordance with the instructions provided by high schools and the Ministry of Education and Training.

Registration timeline and procedure: In accordance with the Ministry's general admissions schedule. Tentatively from July 16 until 5:00 PM on July 28, 2025, candidates must register on the MOET's Admissions Portal (or the National Public Service Portal).

For candidates who wish to use converted scores from international certificates (in accordance with the Academy's regulations) in lieu of the Foreign Language subject score in the admission combination, a certified copy of the international certificate (or an official test result transcript sent directly from the testing organization to the Admissions Council of the Diplomatic Academy) must be submitted to the Academy as the basis for admission consideration.

- In addition to registration as required by the Academy, all candidates applying to the Academy must also register on the MOET's Admissions Portal (or the National Public Service Portal) in accordance with the Ministry's general admissions plan and guidelines.

- The admissions plan may be subject to changes based on further guidance from the Ministry of Education and Training. Candidates are advised to regularly check the

- Lecturers:

- The majority of lecturers are trained at world-leading universities. In addition, many are seasoned diplomats with extensive practical experience in foreign affairs and international integration.
- Academic advisors and homeroom teachers actively provide guidance on both academic matters and career orientation.

- Facilities for training activities: Lecture halls and multifunctional, multimedia classrooms equipped with modern devices; an electronic library with domestic and international learning resources.

- Learning support programs:

- Student learning support activities are organized professionally with diverse formats, such as thematic seminars with prestigious and experienced experts and speakers; field trips; domestic and international exchanges, etc.
- Scientific research activities: Students are encouraged to participate in scientific research projects; knowledge-enhancement and research capacity-building activities; academic conferences, workshops, and scientific forums; idea competitions and startup project contests; scientific research clubs; as well as assisting research projects conducted by the East Sea Institute and the Institute for Foreign Policy and Strategic Studies of the Diplomatic Academy. - Foreign language courses at the Academy:

- Foreign Language 1: A compulsory course. Students may choose one of the following: English, Korean, Japanese, French, or Chinese, and will be placed in classes according to their proficiency level (subject to class size requirements).
- Foreign Language 2: An elective course (counted toward academic results). Students may choose among English, German, Korean, Japanese, French, Spanish, or Chinese, and will be placed in classes according to their proficiency level (subject to class size requirements)

If students do not wish to/ or do not meet the conditions to study a second foreign language, they must take additional courses in Foreign Language 1 with equivalent study hours.

- For English Language Major: Foreign Language 1 is English, while Foreign Language 2 (compulsory) must be another language. For the Asia-Pacific Studies Major, students study Foreign Language 1 relevant to their specialization (English, Korean, Japanese, or Chinese).
- For Asia-Pacific Studies and International Trade Law programs: Students wishing to study a second foreign language must pay tuition fees in accordance with Academy's regulations and will be placed in classes according to proficiency level (subject to class size requirements) .

- Double/dual Degree Program: Students can enroll in a second-degree program if they wish to and meet the academic requirements. Upon graduation, students are awarded two diplomas and transcripts for the two majors.

- Career Guidance/Internship Program: Students are offered career orientation as early as their first and second years; internship opportunities at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Industry and Trade, Foreign Affairs Departments, organizations, enterprises, corporations, media agencies, embassies, and international organizations in

Viet Nam, as well as Vietnamese representative missions abroad. Students are also given priority in being introduced to career opportunities aligned with their specialization. Outstanding graduates may be recruited as lecturers or researchers of the Academy, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, or other Central and local government agencies.

- Student Exchange Program: Students have opportunities to participate in semester-based and short-term exchange programs at the Academy's partner universities, such as Sungshin University (Korea), Gunma University (Japan), Wakayama University (Japan), Laval University (Canada), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), Victoria University of Wellington (New Zealand), University of New South Wales (Australia), Monash University (Australia), Macquarie University (Australia), Flinders University (Australia), MGIMO University (Russia), Fulbright University (Viet Nam), and others.

10.2. Policy on Tuition Fee

The tuition fee policy of the Diplomatic Academy is implemented in accordance with Government Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, on the mechanism for collection and management of tuition fees at educational institutions within the national education system and policies on tuition fee waiver, reduction, and financial assistance for study; service prices in the field of education and training; and Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP dated December 31, 2023, amending and supplementing a number of articles of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

10.3. The Policy on Tuition Fee Waiver, Reduction, and Scholarships

10.3.1. Tuition Fee Waiver, Reduction, and Financial Assistance for Students from Policy-Beneficiary Families

The Diplomatic Academy implements tuition fee waiver, reduction, and financial assistance for study in accordance with Government Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP dated December 31, 2023, amending and supplementing several articles of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

Note: The tuition fee baseline for calculating waiver and reduction is the tuition fee ceiling as prescribed in Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP. Accordingly, the tuition fee amount subject to waiver or reduction for students will be calculated based on the tuition fee ceiling prescribed in the above-mentioned Decrees.

- Beneficiaries eligible for tuition fee waiver and reduction: Based on Articles 14, 15, 16, 18 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

- Mechanism of tuition fee waiver, reduction, financial assistance for study, and financial assistance for tuition fee payment: Based on Article 20 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021.

- The level of tuition fee waiver and reduction: Based on Clause 2, Article 11 of Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP dated December 31, 2023.

- Beneficiaries eligible for study cost assistance: based on Decision No. 66/2013/QĐ-TTg dated November 11, 2013, of the Prime Minister stipulating the policy on study cost assistance for ethnic minority students studying at higher education institutions; and Decree

No. 57/2017/NĐ-CP dated May 9, 2017, of the Government stipulating policies on admission priority and study support for preschool children, pupils, and students from very small ethnic minority groups.

10.3.2. Scholarship Programs for Students

In order to promote academic excellence and research spirit in the student community in general, the Academy has implemented various scholarship programs for students with outstanding academic performance as well as those who overcome financial hardship to strive for academic excellence.

The current scholarship programs at the Academy include:

(i) Scholarship for Academy's entrance valedictorians: to honor the entrance valedictorians of the Academy, students who achieve the highest admission results through the admission methods specified in *sections 2.2 and 2.4 of the Admission Plan* for each training program will receive a Certificate of Merit from the Director of the Academy and a scholarship worth 10.000.000 VND per scholarship. The Academy implements and awards the scholarship after students complete the enrollment procedures.

(ii) Scholarships for Academic Excellence and Training: awarded to students with good academic performance, with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of B or higher, given each semester with varying levels for students with Excellent, Good, and Fair GPAs, valued at 100% - 120% of the maximum monthly tuition fee of the respective program as applied at the Academy (the tuition fee ceiling is specified in Decree No. 81/2021/NĐ-CP dated August 27, 2021, and Decree No. 97/2023/NĐ-CP). Scholarships are granted in order of ranking from Outstanding down until the designated quota is filled based on the annual budget.

(iii) Nguyen Co Thach Scholarship: a scholarship program for talented students with outstanding academic achievements, active participation in extracurricular activities, and demonstrated leadership potential, valued from 5.000.000 VND to 30.000.000 VND per scholarship. This is one of the most prestigious scholarships being implemented by the Academy at present.

(iv) For a Better Future Scholarship: a scholarship program for first-year students with financial difficulties and good academic results. This scholarship partially supports tuition fees in the first academic year, helping students stabilize and thrive in the university environment. For the 20202 - 2025 academic year, the scholarship covers 80%

of the first-year tuition fees at the Academy.

(v) Dream fulfilling Scholarship: for students from the second year onwards, especially those facing difficult circumstances, who strive for academic excellence. Giá trị và số suất học bổng được xác định theo từng năm học. The value and number of scholarships are determined annually. For the 2024 - 2025 academic year, the scholarship is valued from 20,000,000 VND to 30,000,000 per scholarship, depending on individual cases.

(vi) Viet Nam - China Friendship Scholarship: Sponsored by the Embassy of China in Viet Nam, this scholarship is awarded to students majoring in Chinese language studies with good academic performance or to those in financial difficulty striving to achieve academically. Each scholarship is valued at 10.000.000 VND.

(vii) KOCHAM Scholarship (Korean Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Viet Nam): awarded to students facing difficult circumstances and achieving a grade of Good or above, valued at 10.000.000 VND per scholarship.

(viii) Talent Development Scholarship sponsored by the State Capital Investment and Business Corporation (SCIC): awarded to fourth-year students who overcome financial difficulty to achieve excellent academic performance and actively participate in extracurricular activities, with a scholarship value of 10.000.000 VND per scholarship.

(iv) Scholarships for Academic Excellence and Training for Lao Students: awarded to Lao nationals with excellent academic performance at the Academy. The scholarship is offered at three levels (Good, Excellent, Fair), valued at 100% - 150% of the maximum monthly tuition fee of the respective program.

- The conditions, quantity, and values of scholarships are determined based on the annual budget of the Academy and are implemented in accordance with the regulations of the State and the Academy.

- Scholarship at (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vii): are prescribed in Decision No. 35/QĐ-HVNG dated January 11, 2024, issued by the Director of the Diplomatic Academy of Viet Nam.

- Scholarship at (vi), (viii): These scholarship programs may change depending on the policies of the partners and may vary annually.

- Holding an internationally recognized certificate valid until the application submission date (achieving IELTS Academic with a score of 5.5 or higher, with no skill below 5.0, or TOEFL iBT with a score of 46 or higher), or other equivalent certificates.

2. Admission Method

Admission Method: Application Review and Interview.

3. Admission Score

- Admission score includes:
 - (1) Interview score/points;
 - (2) Essay score;
 - (3) International certificate score (converted).

- Formula: Admission Score = M1 + M2 + M3

In which: M1: Interview score (50%).

M2: Essay score (20%).

M3: International certificate score (converted) (30%).

- The admission score is calculated on a 30-point scale, as follows:

Admission Score = [(M1 x 50%) + (M2 x 20%) + (M3 x 30%)] x 3

Candidates will be ranked in descending order of scores until the enrollment quota is filled.
