Biography

Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh currently serves as an Assistant Director General and Acting Dean of the Faculty of International Communication and Culture at the Diplomatic Academy of Vietnam (DAV). From 2010 to 2020, he worked as a lecturer at the Faculty of International Communication and Culture. In 2020, he was appointed Vice Dean of the Faculty. Since 2022, he has also served as Assistant Director General of the Centre for Information and Documentation at DAV. **In June 2026, Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh was appointed Acting Dean of the Faculty of International Communication and Culture.**

At the Centre for Information and Documentation, Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh supports the publication of the *International Studies Journal* and contributes to the management of the Library and Information Technology Department. He is also involved in the development of DAV's web portal and the Academy's digital transformation initiatives.

At the Faculty of International Communication and Culture, he teaches multimedia and communication production courses in both the bachelor's and master's programmes in International Communication. He is also involved in joint academic programmes with Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand; Monash University, Australia; and Macquarie University, Australia.

Dr. Dong Anh Anh has contributed to the development of textbooks for teaching International Communication such as International Communication Textbook, Multimedia Communication Production Textbook, He has also led several research projects funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and by DAV. Dr. Dong Anh won the "Vietnam Anti-Corruption Initiative - VACI" in 2014; participated in the key National Scientific Research Project on Social Networks in 2020.

Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh received the Bronze Award at the Crowbar Awards, an international creative design competition held in Singapore, in 2006, and won Third Prize at the National Youth Informatics Contest in 2015. He represented Vietnam at Apple's Worldwide Developers Conference in 2016 and at the INTV Innovation in Television Conference in Jerusalem in 2017. He was selected as an ASEAN Youth Fellow in 2019, a delegate to the Australia–Vietnam Leadership Dialogue in 2021, and one of 15 young Asian diplomats participating in the Asia Young Diplomats Programme at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., in 2023. In 2025, he was awarded a fellowship to participate in the Emerging Policymakers Programme jointly organised by Tsinghua University, Stanford University, and the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE).

Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh was recognised as a National Outstanding Young Lecturer in 2019. He has received several Certificates of Merit from the Minister of Foreign Affairs in 2019, 2021, and 2023; the Minister of Home Affairs in 2020; and the National Committee on Youth of Vietnam in 2015, 2016, and 2023. He has also been recognised by Singapore's Ministry of Education as qualified to teach at the college level since 2007 and was certified in digital media by the Graduate School of Journalism at the University of California, Berkeley, in 2018.

Dr. Nguyen Dong Anh was elected Secretary of the Youth Union of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 2022-2027 and was re-elected for the 2025–2030 term in November 2025. He also served as a Member of the Executive Committee of the Party Committee of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the 2021–2025 term and was re-appointed for the 2025–2030 term.
